The oldest regularly working windmill in Sussex! Now 322 years old!

Welcome to another edition of our Oldland Mill Newsletter. We hope our news will keep you up to date with everything that goes on at the Mill during the year, as our wonderful volunteers and supporters work hard to keep this historic building in good order and the mill sweeps turning, grinding flour as they were intended to do.

Maintenance

The weather over the winter has certainly been variable! As I write, we are coming towards the end of a long sunny spell with clear blue skies but chilly north-east winds. The Mill is gleaming white in the sun following washing in the autumn and then treatment with Algon, an organic spray which keeps green and black algae at bay, to which the Mill is particularly prone. The grounds are also

looking very well-maintained and wild flowers are being sown on parts of the roadside verge. Despite a lot of rain in December, January and February and some very cold weather at times there has been good attendance at our regular Tuesday and Thursday volunteer days. Amongst various activities, the old cherry-picker has been partially re-hosed to try and stop oil leaks and there have been welding and electrical repairs. The trailer has also been maintained and is ready to pick up the next batch of



local wheat for milling.

The Storm Hatch is at the front of the mill above the windshaft and allows access to areas that otherwise we cannot reach. This hatch is very heavy to open and close and so we have temporarily replaced it while we work to design a lighter replacement.

Spring Milling

Weather conditions and the availability of volunteers have meant a slow start to milling in 2025 with just two productive sessions so far. Happily, conditions are improving, and more sessions are planned for the coming weeks which we hope will enable us to keep pace with the increasing popularity and demand for Oldland Mill flour.



We had a very busy and successful session on New Year's Eve when 105kg were ground. We filled 3x15kg sacks for external bulk sales and 3x20kg sacks for Oldland Mill flour-packing stock. In fact, this session boosted our flour stock to capacity as our policy is to grind only what is required for projected needs. This avoids packed flour stock approaching our "sell by dates" which is at least three months before "best before dates".

With the weather systems in the early part of the year favouring strong wind conditions from an easterly direction, milling was not feasible due to the mature trees around the mill boundary effectively screening the wind and generating unwanted turbulence. The best winds for milling blow from the south-south-east through to the south-south-west as this sector has virtually no obstructions.

Fortunately, with a change in wind direction in mid-April our Milling Team was able to mill 42kgs to replenish our stocks.

Safety & Recycling

The Mill Accident Prevention Team (APT) continues to meet four times a year. We have updated our Safety Health and Environmental Policy Statement, which sets out the intent of the Trust to protect volunteers and members of public from harm when carrying out its activities.

We have recently hosted a familiarisation visit by Burgess Hill Fire Service, which will help us better coordinate emergency situations at the Mill.

With the implementation of Simpler Recycling across the UK the Mill has reviewed its current waste management and recycling arrangements and will be improving waste management especially at open events when we generate more waste than normal.

Membership and 50/50 Club

Renewal of annual membership will take place in May, and we hope to retain those who have loyally supported us over the last year. We will continue to promote membership and support of the Mill at all our events during the year.

We currently have 117 members of the 50/50 club and the Volunteer Team conduct the draw (during their coffee break!) on the third Thursday of every month.
